SPRING OF 1941—
HARVEST IN MEAN

APRIL 4TH WE STARTED OUT IN THE FIELD WORK.
FROM 110 ACERS OF CROP IN 1940 WE DOWNED OUR
ACERAGE TO 220 ACERS IN 1941. MOSTLY WHEAT
SOME OATS AND FLAX. AND BY SUMMER 1ST WE GOT ALL
CLEANED UP WITH ALL OUR SPRING WORK.
THEN WE STARTED TO BREAK UP SOME NEW LAND.
FOR FLAX WE BROKE UP 40 ACERS OF NEW LAND.
THAT PUT INTO FLAX BUT IT WAS SO DRY THAT WE
DID NOT CARE TO SEED ANY MORE. AND SAVED
THESEED FOR NEXT YEAR. WE DID NOT GET
ANY RAIN FROM THE FIRST WEEK IN MAY UNTIL
THE SECOND DAY IN AUGUST. WE PUT UP OUR
CORN HAY IN JULY WITHOUT GETTING A HOPPER OR
BARN ON IT. IN THE LATER PART OF JULY WE
STARTED OUR HARVEST AND WE COULD NOT USE
THE BINDER BECAUSE THE CROP WAS SO DRY.
WE HAD TO USE THE HOPPER AND RAKE.

TO SCRAPE UP WHAT LITTLE CROPS WE HAD
AFTER WE HAD IT CUT AND BLENCHED IT STARTED
TAKING THE HUMIDITY. ANOTHER RAIN
COMES AND IT GOT SO WET WE HAD TO
CHANGE THE HUMIDITY. BECAUSE THE CROP WAS
SO DRY IT FINALLY DRIED OUT AND WE
STACKED IT UP AND SAT ON THEM ONCE OR
TWICE.

WHEN WE RECEIVED OUR CITIZEN PAPERS AND OUR FINAL PROOF OF OWNERSHIP OF OUR LAND WE PUT O.B. PARTY INVITED ALL OUR IMMATE NEIGHBORHOOD AND HAD A FEW PRAYERS GIVING THANKS TO OUR GOD IN HEAVEN. WHO TOOK US OUT OF A LAND OF BLOODSHED. TO A LAND OF FREEDOM. EQUAL RIGHTS AND GIVEN A PIECE OF LAND TO LIVE ON AND MAKE A LIVING. WE HAD A NICE LUNCHON AND REFRESHMENTS. WE ALL GAVE PRAISE TO OUR LORD IN HEAVEN WHO GAVE US WISDOM AND COURAGE TO LEAVE THE OLD COUNTRY AND SEEK THE NEW LAND OF FREEDOM AND EQUALITY. AND I MADE THIS REMARK TO THESE PEOPLE IN THIS NEIGHBORHOOD MANE: FILLED APART OF THE FORCE IN THE TUES WHEN OUR GOD SAID I WILL SCATTER YOU NEVER THIS WORD IN EVERY CUNNER PLACE AND LESS YOU AS ALL OF CIVILIZATION. HARVEST IS IN FULL SWING

ON 1st WHEAT AVERAGED 4 BUSHELS TO THE ACRE ON THIS BUSINESS—PLAIN BUSINESS. WE BARELY GOT ENOUGH SEED FOR NEXT YEAR. WE HAD TO GO OUT AND WORK TO EARN MONEY TO PAY THE THRESH BILL AND SUPPLIES FOR THE WINTER AND WE PREPARED HAY AND COAL AND ALL NECESSARY MATERIALS FOR THE WINTER AND MADE UP OUR MIND TO DOUBLE TIME ACTING FOR 1942. WE CLEANED ALL OUR SEED EARLY THAT FALL AND WE HAD EVERYTHING IN READINES FOR NEXT SPRINGS OF 1942. THE FALL OF 1941 WAS WEI LOT OF RAIN AND SNOW AND SLEET AND THE WINTER SET IN HARD EVER THING WAS UNUSUALLY LONG IT TOOK MORE FEED FOR STOCK. BECAUSE IT WAS SO COOL TO KILL THE SNOW IN THE WINTER IT TOOK UP ICEY WINTER WEAPONS AGAINST THE WINTER. BUT WE HAD NO WEAPONS. IN SEP. TWELVETH 1941 WE APPLIED FOR OUR CITIZEN PAPERS. WE GOT NOTICE TO COME

IN AUGUST 1941—WAS 5 YEARS THAT WE FILED ON OUR LAND AND IT WAS TIME TO PROVE UP ON THE LAND. AND BEFORE WE COULD MAKE FINAL PROOF WE HAD TO TAKE OUT OUR CITIZEN PAPERS SO WE MADE APPLICATION FOR CITIZEN PAPERS TO THE DISTRICT JUDGE FISK. AND HE NOTIFIED US ALL TO APPEAR IN SCHAFER N. DAK. THE 22ND OF APRIL. AND WE TOOK 4 OF THE SAME BOSS AS OUR WITNESSES AND I. JOE. JAKE. THE WINTER SET IN AND WAS COOL AND DRY
