IN COMING OVER TO THEIR PLACE TO ASK FOR HELP OR ANYTHING WE MIGHT NEED. AND THEY WILL DO EVERYTHING THEY CAN TO HELP US. AND THEY DID GOD BLESS THEM. THEY WERE THE FINEST AND BEST NEIGHBORS. ANYBODY WOULD WISH TO HAVE NEIGHBORS LIKE THESE ARE A GODS SENT. WE FIRST DECIDED TO SET UP TEMPORARY CAMP. SO WE TOOK THE MAY RACK WHICH HAD A GOOD WOODEN TIGHT FLOOR AND TURNED INTO OUR SLEEPING QUARTERS. WE PUT A LARGE CANVAS WATERPROOF TARP OVER IT WITH A GARDENERS AND STAKES WHICH MADE A NICE PLACE TO SLEEP AND THE NEXT ONE GROUP UNLOADED THE MATERIALS OF THE WAGON. ANOTHER SETUP AND GOT THE MOWER AND RAKE TOGETHER. AND WE HITCHED THE HORSES TO THE MOWER AND CUT SOME GRASS FOR THE HORSES AND RADED UP MANURE FOR MIDNIGHT USE. NEXT WE DUG INTO A WASH OUT HOLLOW AND FOUND A SUITABLE PLACE INNITRE TO COOK.

THE YOUNG BOYS UNLOADED THE MASON AND TOOK 2 PAILS AND WALKED TO A WOOD AND THREE BOYS BLOWED FORWARD AND TENDED KNEW AND STRANDED 2 PAILS OF WATER. NO ONE USED THEM. IT WAS THE MOSQUITOES.

WE MOVED OUR WAGON TO THE SPOT AND A SUITABLE PLACE INNITRE TO COOK.

THE YOUNG BOYS UNLOADED THE MASON AND WALKED TO A WOOD AND THREE BOYS BLOWED FORWARD AND TENDED KNEW AND STRANDED 2 PAILS OF WATER. NO ONE USED THEM. IT WAS THE MOSQUITOES.

WE HAD ONE MAN ON NIGHT WATCH, BECAUSE WE HAD A COW AND A 3 WEEK OLD CALF AND WE WERE NOT TAKE ANY CHANCES. SO JOE AND I CHANGED OFF EVERY 2 HOURS. WHILE THE OTHER HAD A FULL NIGHT SLEEP BECAUSE THEY WORKED HARDER WHILE WE WERE ON NIGHT WATCH WITH A SHOT GUN.

BUILDING THE NEW HOME

SO BIRD YOU HAD TO STOP EVERY FEW STOPS TO CHASE THEM OF YOU. AND I FINALLY GOT BACK WITH THE WATER. THEN I WAS ELECTED TO BE THE COOK AND IMMEDIATELY GATHERED UP SOME WOOD IN THE COWLES AND BUILT A FIRE PUT ON A KETTLE OF WATER. PEELLED POTATOES AND WE HAD SOME EGGS AND DRY SAUSAGE. AND WITHIN AN HOUR I COOKED DINNER. AND DID NOT HAVE TO CALL THEM THEMES. THIS EVERBODY WAS SATISFIED AND COMMENTED THAT I WAS PICKED FOR THE NIGHT JOB. THIS WAS OUR FIRST MEAL ON OUR OWN LAND. I WASHED UP THE FEW DISHES AND PLACED TO HELP THE REST OF THE MEN. WE MEASURED OFF THE SIZE OF THE HOUSE DROVE IN 4 CORNER STAKES AND PROCEEDED TO DIG A CLEAR. WE GROUP WERE DIGGING AND ANOTHER GROUP CAME UP THE TERN TO ASKING US AND WENT DOWN TO A LEVEL ROCK SPOT WHERE HEAVY THICK GRASS AND ROCKS AND WE BROKE UP 10 FURNACES OR THREE AND TURNED OVER PERTICULARLY.

WE ALSO MADE WOODEN STONE BOATS BUILT JUST LIKE A HOME MADE SLED ONLY LARGER. WE DRAINED THE HORSES TO THE STONEBOAT AND TAKE A SHARP SPADE AND CUT THE SO IN 24 INCH LENGTHS AND PUT A DOZEN OF THESE BLOCKS ON THE STONEBOAT WHICH MADE A LOAD FOR THE TEAM. ONE MAN WAS HAWLING ANOTHER WAS CUTTING AND MEN WERE BUILDING. THE FIRST DAYS WORK WAS DONE BY LINING UP EVERYTHING TO BEREBEDY FOR A GOOD START THE NEXT DAY. ABOUT 5:30 PM IMMEDIATELY GOT BUSY AND WENT OVER AND GOT 2 PAILS FRESH WATER STARTED A FIRE AND ABOUT 6:30 ICHEED . SUPPER. WE ALL HAD A LION'S APETITE. AFTER SUPPER WE POURED AROUND THE PLACE FUMING THINGS UP READY FOR THE NEXT DAY. THE WEATHER WAS VERY HOT THE MOSQUITOES WERE TERRIBLE. WE RETIRED WHEN IT GOT DARK ALL WE HAD WAS A KEROSENE LANTERN AT NIGHT THE WOLVES USED TO HOWL AND AT NIGHT COULD HEAR THE COUGARS AND THE FOXES OF US IT USED TO GIVE YOU THE SHIVER LISTENING TO ALL THE HOWLING.

ON THE LAST WEEK OF OCTOBER WE GOT RAIN AND IT TURNED INTO A LIGHT SNOW IN A FEW DAYS IT CLEARED OF AND IT FROZE UP HARD AND IT WAS NICE FOR ABOUT 2 WEEKS AND ABOUT NOVEMBER 15TH. WE GOT UP ONCE MORNING AND LOOKED OUT AND NOTICED THE WHOLE FLAT WAS COVERED WITH CATTLE. AND WE ASKED SOME RIDERS WHO WERE WITH THEM THAT TOLD US THERE'S 15 3000 HEAD OF CATTLE COMING DOWN FROM THE INDIAN RESERVATION TO THE BIRDHEAD RANCH FOR THEM.

WINTER CHARTERS. IT SURE WAS A SHOT TO SEE 3000 HEAD OF CATTLE IN ONE NIGHT. AND THE COWBOYS TOLD ME THAT WE CAN EXPECT MOST OF THEM OF WINTER WHETHER THEY SET IN AND STAY UNTIL MARCH APRIL. ALSO SURE AS A SHOT THE 15 THOUSAND GOT ON THE ROAD.

NOON OCTOBER 22ND WE STARTED TO DIG OUT WHICH WAS STARTED OUT 4 FEET SQUARE THE FIRST 10 FEET WAS EASIER ALL YOU HAD TO DO WAS TO ROW THE DIRT OUT WHEN WE GOT DOWN TO 10 FEET THEN WE SET UP THE SPECIAL DERRICK AND THE GEARED WHEELS AND ALL YOU HAD TO DO WAS TO TWIN A CRANK AND THE BUCKET CAME UP. AND DUMPED IT AND SENT EACH DOWN TO BE FILLED AGAIN. WE KEPT ON DIGGING THIS WAY EVERY DAY SOE AND I CHANGED OFF POSITIONS. TO BE DOWN IN THE WELL A COUPLE OF HOURS AND THEY CHARGE OFF NINETEEN POSITION WAS EASY. MANY TIMES WE TRIED TO PESUMDE MOSES TO GO DOWN FOR A HURRY BUT HE REFUSED HE SAID HE CAN'T DO IT. UNTIL ONE DAY HE SAID HE WILL TRY IT SO WE PUT HIM IN THE TICKET AND LET HIM DOWN WHEN HE WAS HALF WAY DOWN HE TRIED TO HOLD ON TO BIRNS KNEE UP

WE CONTINUED THIS WORK FOR ABOUT 3 WEEKS AND GOT DOWN TO 55 FEET WHEN ONE MORNING I WENT DOWN AND DUG UP A FEW BUCKETS WHEN A CHUNK OF DIRT 3 TIMES THE SIZE OF ME SLID DOWN BESIDE ME AND AS ICK WAS THE BUCKET WAS DOWN IMMEDIATELY STEPPED INTO TO BUCKET AND HONOURED UP AND UP JOE WAS SURPRISED TO SEE ME COMING UP AND IT OLD HIM WHAT HAPPENED AND NEITHER ONE OF US WENT DOWN AGAIN. BECAUSE IT STARTED TO CAVE IN. WHAT WE SHOUD OF DONE WAS TO BUILD A SQUARE WOODEN CURBING AND SLIDE IT DOWN IN 10 FOOT SECTION BUT IT WAS TOOLATE SO WE ABANDONED THE WELL AFTER 3 WEEKS OF HARD WORK OF 2 MEN. AND WEARIE LUCKY TO BE BACK TO TELL ABOUT IT. WE DID NOT USE THIS DRAFTER WE WERE EVERY DAY. BY COMING IN AND BY GDS MANY TIMES THESE WILLS LET OF A POISIVES GDS WILLS IS SURE DEATH. WE CAN CONSIDER OURSELF LUCKY TO GET OUT OF THIS.

ACCORDING TO THE JEWISH TRADITION THEY HAD TO HAVE A MINION CONSISTED OF TEN MEN. SO MOSES SUGGESTED I SHALL COME INTO WILLISTON. THE SAME CHRONICKY FAMILY WORKED TOGETHER AND ALSO BUILT THEMSELVES ANICE 2 ROOM HOUSE MADE OF THE SAME HOME MALEBRICK AND THEY MOVED IN TO THEIR NEW HOME AND BOUGHT 4 HORSES AND 2 COWS AND 25 QUAILERS AND STARTED THEIR FARMING OPERATIONS AND IT DID NOT TAKE LONG BEFORE HE ALSO LEARNED THE ART OF FARM OPERATIONS AND HE LIKE ALL THE REST OF US LEARNED HOW TO OPERATE MACHINERY AND HORSES AND IN A SHORT TIME HE WAS A FULL FLEDGE FARMER.

AND IN MAY 1908 THE MAX SHERFIS FAMILY ARRIVED AND MORRIS THEIR OLDER SON WHO WAS HERE IN ADVANCE LOCATED SAME LAND FOR THEM. AND MORRIS AND SON PLACED ON THEIR HOMESTEADS ABOUT 4 MILES SOUTH OF LEMARS AND BUILT A HOME OF LEMARS BRICK AND STONE IN OCTOBER 1908.

ARTICULAY MADE UP SEVERAL THOUSAND OF THEM THAT WERE READY TO BUILD. NEXT WAS TO GO TO THE WOODS AND PICK THE KIND OF TIMBERS YOU NEED. CHOPP THEM DOWN AND TAKE EM HOME AND READY FOR THE BUILDING.

AND THEY STARTED TO BUILD AND BUILT A HOUSE OF 4 ROOMS FOR THE OLD FOLKS. AND A BARN FOR THE HORSES AND CATTLE. AND WHILE THIS WERE MAKING ALL THESE PREPARATIONS. SAM AND BESSIE GOT MARRIED ON JUNE 10TH 1901 IN WILLISTON WEDDING. THE WEDDING TOOK PLACE IN THEIR HOME IN WILLISTON. AFTER THE WEDDING THEY CAME OUT TO THE HOMESTEAD. THEY HAD NO PLACE WHERE TO LIVE SO I TURNED OVER MY UNCLE HOME TO THEM AND THERE THEY SPENT THEIR HONEY MOON TRIP. THEY STAYED IN MY HOME UNTIL THEY BUILT A HUSBAND HOME. WHICH

NEVER BEFORE IN OUR LIFE DID WE EVER TOUCH A PLOW, OR HITCHED A HORSE TO A PLOW. BY A CAREFUL STUDY AND WATCHING OUR NEIGHBORS IT TOLD NOT TAKE LONG BEFORE WE LEARNED HOW TO HANDLE FARM OPERATIONS. AND THAT SUMMER SPRING OF 1910 WE PUT IN 110 ACERS OF CROP. WHEAT - OATS - FLAX. AND A GARDEN.

THE 1910 SUMMER WAS NOT SO FAVORABLE IT WAS DRY ALL WINTER BEFORE AND NOT MUCH RAIN IN THE SPRING AND VERY LITTLE IN THE SUMMER. WE DROVE INTO WILLISTON AND BOUGHT A MOWER AND HAY RAKE AND PLATE AND BOUGHT A RAILROAD BINDER. WE MADE TWO TRIPS TO BRING THE MACHINERY OUT HOME AND SET IT UP. WE FIRST SET UP THE MOWER MACHINERY AND WE STARTED TO CUT WHEAT. I DROVE THE MOWER AND JOE DROVE THE PLATE. AND WHEN WE HAD CUT SOMETHING WE LEFT STARTED TO Haul IT IN TO THE CORN. WE PUT UP 2 GOOD SIZE STAKES WHICH WERE DONE WITH THE MOWER. THIS WAS THE FIRST HAY SEEDING WE DO FIRST ON THE RAILROAD CROWN.

AND A PERIOD OF 3 YEARS WE HAD 12 FAMILIES. AND THE FULL OF 1909 WE HAD OUR FIRST COMMUNITY CHURCH GATHERINGS FOR OUR LOCAL WORKS. MR. MAX SHER AND MR. PAPERMASTER ARE CHARACTERS ETHEM WITH THE CHURCH GATHERINGS AND 1910 COMING A TORN. AND EVERY FALL OR OUR CHURCHES WED ALL GET TOGETHER REUNITED AND WORKS OUR CHURCH SERVICES THERE. AND SINCE THE EXPANSIVE PROGRESS,

AND STRETCHED THE SPRING LONG ENOUGH TO LOOK LIKE IT WAS PART OF THE SPRUNG AND GOT IT BENT BACK AND STRETCHED AGAIN. IT WAS BLESSED. I WOULD NOT USE TOOK OUT THE RAILROAD AND PUT IT IN TWO PLACES. ONE AT THE END AND ONE IN THE MIDDLE. AND THEN BENT IT DOWN AND GOT IT IN PLACE.

AFTER WORKING FOR 3 YEARS JOE AND I DECIDED WE ALSO WOULD LIKE TO GO ON OUR LAND AND FARM. WE BOTH SAVED UP A LITTLE MONEY. SO ON THE WINTER OF 1909 AFTER THE BIG CROP WHICH GAVE US MORE COURAGE. WE DECIDED TO QUIT OUR JOBS AND MOVE ON THE FARM. AND IN DECEMBER WE DROVE TO SCHAFER AND BOUGHT 4 HEAD OF YOUNG HORSES AND 2 SETS OF HARNESS AND MACHINERY TO START FARMING. WE DROVE TO THE WOODS EVERY DAY AND CHOPPED TIMBER & POSTS FOR OUR BARNS AND WE BUILT A BARN ON MY PLACE AND A BARN ON JOE'S PLACE. AND WHEN SPRING CAME WHICH WAS ARELD EARLY ONE IN 1910 WE WERE READY FOR ACTION. ON MY PLACE I HAD 65 ACERS ALREADY BROKE UP IN 1909. WHICH WAS ALL READY FOR THE DISC AND THE DISCING AND JOE DECIDED TO RIDE HIS LAND FOR BREAKING BY PICKING OUT THE ROCKS. AND IT KEPT HIS BOTH HANES SWELLING. AND HIS COOKING OVER OVER ACTUAL BREAST.

AND WE WENT ALONG WITH THE MACHINING UNTIL OUR NEIGHBORHOOD GOT ALL THE GRAIN THRESHED. WITH THE AVERAGE FOR THE NEIGHBORHOOD WHEAT 8 BUSHELS TO THE ACRE CARS 30 BUSHELS TO THE ACRE FLAX 6 BUSHELS. THE PRICE IN WHISTON WAS WHEAT 80¢ OR 13¢ THE CROP FOR 1940 WAS NOT MUCH TO BRAG ABOUT FIRST WE HAD TO FIGURE OUT HOW MANY ACRES WE ARE GOING TO PLANT NEXT YEAR AND SET ASIDE SOME MANY BUSHELS OF EACH GRAIN FOR SEED AND WE INTENDED TO INCREASE OUR ACRESAGE SO WE DID NOT HAVE VERY MUCH TO SELL. WE HAD TO SELL A FEW BUSHELS TO SETTLE OUR THRESHING BILL AND BUY A FEW SUPPLIES FOR WINTER.

WE THEN THRESHED THE ENTIRE COMMUNITY THAT TOGETHER AND DUG THEIR CORN FOR THEM. WHILE THE WHEAT WAS EASY TO DISCERN AND NO WHEAT HAD TO BE SEPARATED FROM THE GRAIN.
